### Creating the Parks System that Seattleites Deserve

Seattle Proposition 1 will replace the expiring levy with stable, dedicated funding for our beloved parks by addressing a wide variety of parks system needs including: major maintenance like replacing leaky roofs, boiler replacements, and critical electrical upgrades; ongoing maintenance like cleaning restrooms, trash pickup, and mowing; restoring staffing, hours, and programs for kids and seniors at community centers; acquiring new parks and open space to meet increased demand; funding for major maintenance at Woodland Park Zoo and the Seattle Aquarium; and funding to protect habitat and open spaces in the city.

All of this critical work will cost the owner of a \$400,000 home only \$4 a month more than the expiring parks levy.

## **Dedicated Parks Funding Will Serve Us All**

Right now our parks must compete with other city services like police, fire, and human services, so when budgets are tight parks lose out. We can do better. Seattle Proposition 1, unanimously approved by the City Council, will provide the resources we need to ensure that our parks serve every neighborhood and community across Seattle. Our parks system is one of our greatest democratic institutions, bringing together people from all walks of life and all races and ethnicities to share equally in the beauty of nature and the benefits of recreation. Let's ensure this treasured legacy is enhanced for future generations to enjoy.
