Want to see a light rail station at NE 130th and I-5?

Sound Transit is considering a light rail station at NE 130th and I-5

- This station would provide easy and fast connections to Broadview,
 Bitterlake, Haller Lake, Pinehurst,
 Olympic Hills, Lake City and Cedar Park.
- A new Metro bus route and bike lanes along the 130th/125th corridor would connect these communities with light rail.
- Pedestrians in Haller Lake, Jackson
 Park and Pinehurst would easily be
 able to walk to the station.
- At least 3,200 riders are expected to board at a 130th Street station daily, from the nearby neighborhoods on foot, by bike or by bus.
- The station would cost about \$25
 million, less than the cost of a
 parking garage to be built at a
 suburban station.
- The station would open in 2023.

A decision will be made in April, but the Sound Transit Board and Seattle Mayor and City Council need to hear from the community now.

Currently, Sound Transit does not see a 130th Street station as a priority and it is not expected to pass. But, your email to them can make a difference.
